Rules for Paper Presentation

- A team should have a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 3 participants.
- The duration of the presentation should be between 4 and 6 minutes.
- The number of slides to be prepared should not be less than 8 and not more than 12.
- Each team will be asked two questions by judges related to presentation.
- The presentation will be judged by judges on the basis of : **Content of presentation, Confidence and verbal Skills, Use of graphics, Sound, video and question round**

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S. No.	Name of Event	Rules
1	Bridge Building	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 3 members make a team.• Only wooden popsicle sticks and white glue can be used to make your bridge.• You may use no more than 120 popsicle sticks.• The bridge must be at least 300 mm long and have an overall width of at least 100 mm.• Please remember that load testing may result in the destruction of the bridge.• Total time allotted for the event is 60 minutes, and after 2 hours of making load testing will be done in front of judges.• The load will be applied in the center of the span on the roadbed surface.• A bridge may be considered to have "failed" under the test load if the bridge components break, crack, or separate, causing the collapse.• Items used: Popsicle sticks, gum, and construction paper.
2	Solid PRO Test	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Maximum one participant per college is allowed.• The topic will be announced on the spot.

3	Object Scaling Drawing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Maximum one participant per college is allowed.• A problem to test the logic will be given on the spot.• Participants must bring their own required items
4	CATAPULT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2 members make a team.• Items used: Popsicle sticks, gum, construction paper, cardboard, and any waste material.• Total time allotted for the event is 60 minutes after 2 hours of making CATAPULT.• Testing will be done by calculating the distance of the object through it.
5	AUTOCAD 2D PLAN	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A drawing will be given to participants, & they will have to draw it in AUTOCAD.• The drawing should be made with proper dimensioning.• Any discrepancy leads to the disqualification of the candidate.• Total time allotted for the event is 25 minutes and 5 minutes to think over the matter.• Candidates who finish the task first will win the first round.• The shortlisted candidate will appear in round 2.• The same rules must be followed in round 2

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6	SURVEY HUNT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A team shall be of 3 members only.• In the first round, a screening test shall be conducted, and the top 4 teams will be selected for the second round based on the accuracy of the work.• Time allotted for the task is 1 hour.
	Tech Whiz	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• One participant per team is allowed.• Logos and computer parts will be shown on the spot.• A total of 2 wrong answers out of 5 will result in disqualification.
7	Logic X (Programming in C & C++)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A maximum of two participants per team is allowed.• A problem to test the logic will be given on the spot.• C/C++ language will be used to solve the given problem• Judgment of this event will be based on solution strategy and time consumption used to solve the problem, correctness, and completeness of the program.
9	Logic Gates	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• One participant per team is allowed.• The statement problem will be provided on the spot.• The logic will have to be built on the basis of proper examination of the given result provided with the Logic Gates to be used
10	Short Movie (6-8 Minutes)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Max. 8 teams• 10 students in each team• The movie should be on the topic given.• The topic will be given 4 days prior to the events.• No abusiveness or vulgarity will be allowed; otherwise, they will be disqualified.• The movie will be submitted to the coordinators on the said date.
11.	On the Spot Poster Making	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The theme for the poster should be related to AI, marketing & business.• Each Participant can post only one poster.• The poster must be made on the A3-size (11.7 * 16.5 inches) sheet with margins (0.5 inches) drawn with a black pen/marker.• A poster can be made using pencil, crayon, watercolor, oil paint, etc.• Photographs, wires, other 3D objects, and printouts won't be acceptable. It should be original and hand-made.• The topic of the poster and the theme should be clearly mentioned at the top margin of the poster.• The decision of the judges will be final



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12.	Calligraphy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Only cursive calligraphy is allowed. Mixing print and cursive styles is not permitted.• Writing must be done using blue or black ink only.• Participants must use the paper provided by the organizers.• The content/theme given by the organizers must be strictly followed.• Thin upstrokes and thick downstrokes should be clearly visible.• Letters must follow a straight baseline with a consistent slant.• Uniform spacing should be maintained between letters, words, and lines.• Capital letters must be neat and proportional to lowercase letters.• Minimal flourishes are allowed; excessive decoration will lead to marks deduction.• Overwriting, erasing, cutting, or using correction fluid is not allowed.• The sheet must be clean and free from ink spills or smudges.• Participants must complete the work within the allotted time.• The judges' decision will be final and binding.
13	Code Sprint (coding Challenge in JAVA & Python)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Max 2 Participants• A problem to test logic will be given on the spot.• No built-ins to be used• Use of Internet is strictly prohibited

14	Bug Hunters (Debugging Contest)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Only 1 Participant is allowed• Use of Internet is strictly prohibited• Pre-written code will be given• Only error correction is allowed
15	Mapping Semester-Based Learning CSE Model	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Max 2 Participants• Group subjects by core computing concepts such as data computation, systems, intelligence, and security.
16	Circuit Design Challenge	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Participants design simple PCBs (e.g., LED flashers).• Judged on design time, optimization, and creativity.• LED Blink Challenge Task: Make an LED blink using given components.• Skills: Basic electronics• Time: 5–10 minutes• Twist: Blink in a given pattern (slow–fast–slow)
17	E-puzzle	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Answer as many basic ECE questions as possible in 60 seconds.



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18	Robo War	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Students design the robot and try to push it out from the marked area.
19	Towel Art	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Entry per institution will be one.A team of 2 students can participate at a time.The time duration for this event is 15 mins.Each team will bring their own towels for the event.Mobile phones are not allowed.It should be done in front of the judges.
20	No Flame Cooking	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Entry per institution will be one.A team of 2 students can participate at a time.The time duration for this event is 30 mins.Ingredients should be brought by participants themselves.Mobile phones are not allowed.Event judges' decisions will be final and binding.Preparation should be done in front of the judges.
21	Preparation of Mocktails	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Entry per institution will be one.Each team will consist of 2 members.The time duration for this event is 30 mins.Each team will bring their own ingredients for the event.Mobile phones are not allowed.Preparation should be done in front of the judges.
22	Rangoli	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Size: 2'x2' to 4'x4' (5% permissible variation)Only one medium may be used: poster colors, flower petals, sawdust, pulses, or rice (without pasting).The art form may be freehand, pictorial, or descriptive (e.g., mandna, alpna, alekhan, Kollam, and Rangoli).Participants must prepare the Rangoli within the space provided by the organizers.Topic/theme will be given on the spot by the judges.Accessories (e.g., sieve, spoon, scale) are allowed.
23	Mehndi	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The event will be conducted on a subject/idea given on the spot.Additional instructions will be announced on the spot.Participants must bring their own materials; only traditional Indian motifs are allowed (no Arabian Mehndi or glitter).Credit will be given for originality, creativity, and aesthetic sense.No handprints, molds, or decorative materials are permitted.Mehndi must extend to the palmar side of the forearm (minimum 6 inches).
